Nonfat Dry Milk - Western U.S.

Report 6 - Released on February 11, 2021

Low/medium heat nonfat dry milk (NDM) prices shifted lower on the range and mostly price series this week. Buyers are continuing to purchase weekly spot loads. Spot prices are mixed on various market exchanges. Low/medium heat NDM production remains strong in the West. Some inventories are at lower levels, while other operations' supplies are readily available for buyers' demands. The low/medium heat NDM market tone is unsettled. High heat NDM prices are steady to a bit lower. Offers are limited with tight supply in the West. The majority of drying time is scheduled to low/medium heat NDM. Scheduled high heat NDM production is lower. In general, high heat NDM markets are mostly steady.
