Dry Whey - Central U.S.

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Central dry whey prices are the same week over week. There are mixed reports on availability. Some contacts say inventories have been built up, while others are saying dry whey offers are quiet. Some producer contacts say there is more dry whey availability in the Midwest than West. Milk is growing in availability, and a growing number of contacts say cheesemakers are taking on growing milk loads. High protein availability is very firm, therefore more production is edging into those markets, instead of into dry whey. Despite some weaker permeate/deproteinized whey performances, some animal feed whey changed hands higher on the top end. Whey market tones are uncertain.
