Nonfat Dry Milk - Western U.S.

Report 46 - Released on November 17, 2022

In the West, all facets of the low/medium heat nonfat dry milk (NDM) price range and mostly price series moved higher this week. Domestic sales of low/medium heat NDM are active; some stakeholders say purchasers are buying additional loads in preparation for end of year holidays. International interest in low/medium heat NDM is steady. Spot loads of low/medium heat NDM are available for purchasing. Stakeholders say low/medium heat NDM production is steady, though some plant managers say they are operating reduced drying schedules due to labor shortages and delayed deliveries of production supplies. High heat NDM prices moved higher this week. Contacts report strong demand for high heat NDM, though production remains limited.
