Nonfat Dry Milk - Western U.S.

Report 47 - Released on November 22, 2022

The West price range for low/medium heat nonfat dry milk (NDM) tightened this week. The mostly price series for low/medium heat NDM shifted higher on both ends. Domestic demand for low/medium heat NDM is steady, and stakeholders note international sales are unchanged this week. Loads of low/medium heat NDM are available for spot purchasing. Drying operations are running steady production schedules, as milk remains available. Some plant managers say they are operating below capacity due to labor shortages and delayed deliveries of production supplies. High heat NDM production remains limited, and spot inventories are tight. Stakeholders say demand for high heat NDM is strong. The price range for high heat NDM moved higher at the bottom of the range, though the top was unchanged.
