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Nonfat Dry Milk - Western U.S.

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In the West, prices for low/medium heat nonfat dry milk (NDM) moved lower across all facets of the range and mostly price series. Demand domestically is moderate. Loads are available to meet current spot market demand. Demand from international purchasers is light.

Stakeholders indicate export demand is mostly limited to filling immediate needs. Milk output at the farm is seasonally lower and handlers report milk component decreases, reducing low/medium heat NDM production. High heat NDM prices moved lower on the bottom end and higher on the top end. High heat NDM production is steady. However, some manufacturers anticipate running only low/medium drying schedules until October. Some stakeholders report high heat NDM loads as tighter. High heat NDM demand is steady to moderate.
