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Nonfat Dry Milk - Western U.S.

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In the West, prices for low/medium heat nonfat dry milk (NDM) moved lower on the top end of the range and across all facets of the mostly price series. Demand is moderate domestically. Loads are available to accommodate current spot market demand. Export demand is light. Stakeholders relay international purchasers are limiting orders to immediate needs. Low/medium heat NDM production is decreasing as milk output is seasonally lower. High heat NDM prices are unchanged. Manufacturers scheduling the longer high heat NDM drying times relay steady production, while others relay October/November starts to high heat NDM drying schedules. Demand for high heat NDM is steady to moderate.
