Low/medium heat nonfat dry milk (NDM) prices decreased again at both ends of the range and mostly price series in the West. Demand from domestic buyers is lighter. Sellers report loads offered at last week's prices are generally not receiving bites. Demand from international buyers varies from steady to light. Mixed interest from buyers in Mexico is reported. Production schedules are steady. Spot load availability is somewhat tight. High heat NDM prices continued the trend, decreasing at both ends of the range. Production schedules are steady. Demand is mixed. Some manufacturers note contractual demand for Q3/Q4 is stronger than anticipated.
