



Dry Whey - Central U.S.

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In the Central region, contacts say the market for dry whey is steady. Prices are unchanged across the range and mostly price series this week. Production, inventory, and demand notes are all unchanged this week. Some manufacturers continue to prioritize production of whey protein concentrates, limiting their dry whey output. Production is steady overall though, as other manufacturers say they continue to run busy schedules. Contacts say that strong demand persists for some brands of dry whey, these loads are trading at prices near the top of the range, as spot inventories are tight. Spot loads priced closer to the bottom of the range are readily available, though demand for these loads is lighter. The market for animal feed whey is quiet, and prices are unchanged this week. Contacts say there is very little animal feed whey being produced currently, but demand remains light and inventories are tight.
